Presentation

On behalf of Monaco South Optimists, **Steve Kady** presented Glen Stenson with a Philips Heart Defibrillator for the Legion Hall. Glen thanked the club and having recently celebrated his 86th birthday shared that he recognizes the lifesaving value these machines have. See picture on next page. How to Use a Defibrillator

A defibrillation sends an electrical shock to the heart. The Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is a device capable of automatically detecting a heart rhythm that requires a shock. The AED will charge itself and prompt the user to deliver a shock to the victim. AED's analyze the victim's heart rhythm several times to be certain it is a shockable rhythm.

All AEDs can be operated by using these steps:

- 1. Confirm cardiac arrest by checking to see if the victim is unable to respond and there is no breathing when you open the airway (by tilting back the head and lifting the chin up).
- 2. Turn on the AED.
- 3. Apply pads to the victim's bare chest as shown.
- 4. If necessary plug the wire from the pads into the AED (usually next to a flashing light).
- 5. Allow the AED to analyze the heart rhythm.
- 6. If a shock is indicated by the AED, push the shock button when instructed.
- 7. If a shock is recommended (sometimes it is not) make certain everyone "stands clear." and does not touch the patient.
- 8. If the patient is still not breathing, start CPR. Give 30 chest compressions and then 2 rescue breaths and continue this cycle until the AED gives further instructions or the patient starts breathing.


