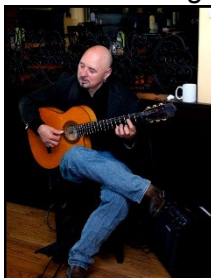

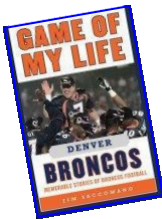

Speaker, Kylene Trask, The Adoption Exchange

Paul Bernard introduced our speaker, Kylene Trask, The Adoption Exchange's Director of Development.



The Adoption Exchange has been connecting children and families since 1983. They believe every child deserves a family. They provide connection between foster care and people who want to adopt. It's an eight-

state (Missouri, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Utah, Wyoming and Colorado) organization based at 14232 East Evans Avenue in Aurora. They help assist three types of adoption: infants, international, and special needed.

Here are some interesting statistics Kylene shared with us:

- ⇒ Average age of placement is 11
- ⇒ The largest placement they've had is eight siblings adopted by one family
- ⇒ 400,000 kids in foster care in the US
- ⇒ 104,000 legally available for adoption
- ⇒ 60% of the 104,000 are adopted by foster parents
- ⇒ 20% of 104,000 are adopted by relatives
- ⇒ 20% remain - those are the kids they are targeting
- ⇒ The Adoption Exchange has connected 6,988 kids since 1983, including 186 so far this year
- ⇒ 64% of kids are age 9 plus, 42% are in a group of 2 siblings or more
- ⇒ 56% are kids of color
- ⇒ 60% are boys

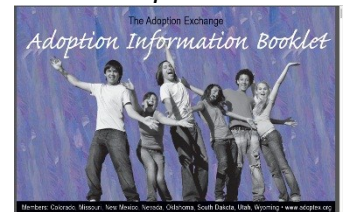
Families interested in adopting can go to www.adoptex.org to look at photos and get information on kids. There are also adoption parties two time a year, at Boondocks and White Fence Farm, which allow kids to mingle with prospective families.

There are also profile parties with just the parents. Case workers share information on the kids and teach basic terminology and language.

How can you change a child's life? Volunteer at a class or make a donation. Their funding is mostly from grants: 3 program special federal grants, part of National Research Center, some state funding, foundations and private donors. Additionally, 82% of donations go direct to programs and services.

When asked for a show on hands, at least 12 to 15 members have either been adopted or have adopted a child. Kylene shared a quote from an adopted child that probably carried a good bit of meaning for those men: "*Getting adopted is like sitting down after standing up for a long time.*"

Kylene's presentation ended with John Young asking if she would adopt him. No one at this editors table could remember anyone ever saying "No!" faster than Kylene did! You may download *The Adoption Information Booklet*, @ www.adoptex.org/adoption.
