

Susie and her husband Wayne started "Sweet Dream in a Bag" in order to provide a gift of new bedding to children in poverty and in difficult circumstances who did not have a chose to be there. Sweet Dream also give the entire family acceptance, love, encouragement and hope.

The unique thing about their program is that each child gets to select his/her own bedding from the various "packages" furnished by the organization. Packages


At other times, this little word has real special meaning. People stir UP trouble, line UP for tickets, work UP an appetite, and think UP excuses.
