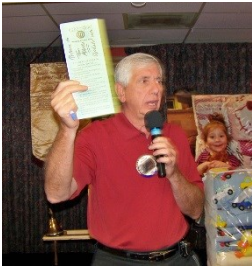

3. Are there other

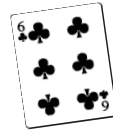

Speaker: Susie Fox Sweet Dream in a Bag

Susie Fox was our speaker today, coming highly recommended by the Tamarac Club. Susie and her husband Wayne started "Sweet Dream in a Bag" in order to provide a gift of new bedding to children in poverty and in difficult circumstances who did not have a choice to be there. Sweet Dream also give the entire family acceptance, love, encouragement and hope.

The unique thing about their program is that each child gets to select his/her own bedding from the various "packages" furnished by the organization. Packages consist of a soft fleece thrown blanket tied with a colorful ribbon, a small stuffed animal to love, and a card of encouragement in a clear vinyl bag. Larger packages

es contain a twin comforter, sheet set, pillow cases with pillow and a personalized booklet.

A volunteer also reads with the child a fun, positive, personalized story that builds self esteem and encourages independent responsibility. Bags are portable so children can take their cozy spaces with them and have sweet dreams wherever they may have to move. Susie and Wayne have visited several Optimist Clubs seeking volunteers to help deliver "Dream Bags" and read to the kids who receive them.
