Fooling Us With Numbers Paul Bernard

Our speaker today was our own Paul Bernard, with


a presentation to show how graphs can be used to manipulate data to advance an idea or agenda. Within a pictograph, chart or graph, data can be used and organized to show what you want to show. Tactics such as changing scale, base point, or moving the y or x axis can make the visual presentation more dramatic.



People are visual learners and tend to ignore the scale and look only at the charts and images, which can lead to false conclusions, even though the data is technically correct. Paul showed many examples side by side with the same inputs, but different visual results. It certainly was a lesson to make sure you understand the information you are being presented, and what sort of bias may be being presented.




