Medical Couple Change People's Lives

The featured speakers at the May 25, 2007 meeting of the Optimist Club of Monaco South were Richard and Edie Bryan. Richard is a pediatrician, and Edie is a nurse. They are part of Uplift International, a medical organization which surgical corrects cleft palates and lips in Filipino children.

Dr. Bryan explained that cleft palates and lips occur in one in every 200 U.S. births, and in one in every 400 births in the Philippines. Because this birth defect is quickly corrected in American babies, it is rarely noticed in this country. In the Philippines, however, children who do not receive corrective surgery suffer not only from being able to learn to speak correctly, but from the ridicule of other children. Thus, many of them choose not to go to school, and their lives are irreparably harmed by an easily-corrected birth defect.

Uplift International was started in 1989 by Colorado maxillofacial surgeon Jaime Yrastorza, who was born in the Philippines but educated in the United States. Dr. Yrastorza now leads a group of physicians, nurses and others on annual two-week stays in the Philippines, where they perform the

corrective surgery free of charge. In February of 2007 a group of 51 brought three tons of medicine, supplies and equipment and performed 86 surgeries.

The surgery can be performed on adults, but, according to Dr. Bryan, it is only children who can hope to significantly improve the ability to speak understandably. This is because adults have ingrained speech patterns which makes improving their speech after surgery the equivalent of learning a new language.

Because the group returns year after year to the same country, it is possible to find former patients to see how they have progressed. Finding patients who are leading happy, productive, self-confident lives is very rewarding, and it is this that shows the Bryans that they are truly making a change in people's lives.
