Phony Debt Collectors Make Menacing Threats

The Denver area is receiving a rash of phone calls from so-called "debt collectors." In fact, they are con artists alleging that the person owes money on a past debt. They claim to represent a bank or other business, and will harass the victim by continuously calling back. These callers are specifically targeting older persons and are using scare tactics such as the loss of the home, or jail time if the individual doesn't immediately pay up. There have also been reports of debt collection scams over the Internet—most likely the result of on-line accounts that have been hacked.

Stacey Pendleton, Colorado History Day

Karl Geil introduced Stacey Pendleton, Assistant State Coordinator who reported on Colorado History Day. The mission of National History Day is to improve the teaching and learning of history in elementary and secondary schools so that students become better prepared, knowledgeable citizens. The State History contest is tomorrow, Saturday, on the Auraria Campus. Students must first compete in their regional contests and then regional winners are then eligible for the State History contest. Ten districts compete in Colorado. Two winners go on to national completion.

National History Day is held in June, this event is the culmination of the year's research and practice. Individuals and teams from around the country converge for four days of competition.

There are two divisions:

- Junior Division (grades 6-8)
- Senior Division (grades 9-12)

Students research a historical topic of interest to them that relates to a broad annual theme. They then create a project to convey the results of their research and analysis, in one of five categories:

- dramatic performances
- imaginative exhibits
- multimedia documentaries
- · research papers
- · interactive web sites

These projects are then evaluated at local, state, and national competitions.
