Don Thomson told members about Jimmie recently volunteering to be the school representative for the Super Citizen program and how he did such a wonderful job of organizing and running the award program at his school. One thing we always will remember about Jim was his commanding voice...he never needed a microphone.

Karl Geil was wearing his uniform tie provided by Jimmie Brown during his tenure as Governor of the District. Serving as Jimmie's secretary during that time, Karl came to know Jimmie and appreciate his efforts for Optimist International (O.I.). During a recent Super Citizen presentation, Karl was reminded that students were being recognized for their positive contributions and efforts. In essence, they were displaying many of the same attributes demonstrated by Jimmie Brown.
