The Council award winner was Keenan B. Kimmick, Troop 199, for his Red Rocks Park and Amphitheater Trail. Park authorities estimated the trail restoration could cost as much as \$40,000 (if done by the government). The projects by Scouts cost only \$5,257. Keenan spent 173 hours on the project. Timber steps, water bars and rock check dams were required. The 120 foot trail, previously closed, is now open to literally tens of thousands of people is in excellent condition.

senting the Optimist "Excellence in Education" award to recognize the educators who have supported our Super Citizen Program.


Drawing & Final Bell
