At each weekly meeting, gift cards usable at King Soopers and Safeway are available for sale to members. These are available in multiples of \$25.00, with no maximum. The member uses the card like a debit card for groceries and gasoline at dozens of stores associated with King Soopers or Safeway (see the list on the back of the card). The member gets full value for the card, but the club buys them for 95% of face value, thereby earning 5% of the face value as a fundraiser for Monaco South.
