The letter goes on to detail Emilie's recovery from Toxic Epidermis Necrolysis caused by Stevens Johnson Syndrome. With more than 60% of her body (inside and out)



covered with an extreme rash, Emilie was placed in an induced coma for ten days while they monitored the sloughing of much of her skin. As a result of this she was also blinded. Through strength of will and support from her husband,

her family, and medical experts, Emilie has recovered to the point that she will compete in the Iron Man competition, consisting of a 2.4 mile swim followed by a 112 mile bike ride, followed by running 26.2 miles. You can see the various courses by going to, http://ironmancda.com/.

Kids Pre-surgery Talk


Two little kids are in a hospital, lying on stretchers next to each other outside the operating room. The first kid leans over and asks, "What are you in here for?"
