## Memorial Day History

Memorial Day is a United States federal holiday observed on the last Monday of May (May 31 in 2010). Originally proclaimed as Decoration Day in 1868 by General John A. Logan, national commander of The Grand Army of the Republic to honor the dead of both sides of the American Civil War, it was celebrated on May 30 of each year. The alternative name of "Memorial Day" was first used in 1882, but did not become the official name of the holiday until 1967. In 1968, the United States Congress passed the Uniform Holidays Bill, which moved three holidays from their traditional dates to a specified Monday in order to create a convenient three-day weekend. Many people believe that this action has diminished the importance of the holiday and has decreased the number and extent of celebrations. A number of veteran's organizations advocate returning to a fixed date, although the significance of the date is tenuous. A national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 p.m. local time and many people observe this holiday by visiting cemeteries and memorials. Flags are flown at half-staff from dawn to noon on this day and many communities have organizations, which place flags on the gravesites in National Cemeteries. Some Americans view Memorial Day as the unofficial beginning of summer and Labor Day as the end.

## Our Speaker



Our speaker today was Martin Cobb. Mr. Cobb, a retired U.S. Navy veteran is currently a volunteer on behalf of <a href="Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve">Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve</a>, which is a Department of Defense agency that seeks to develop and promote a culture in which all American employers support and value the military service of their employees. It does so by recognizing outstanding support, increasing awareness of the law, and resolving conflicts through mediation.

There are currently 135,000 reservists who are on active duty and there have been more than 750,000 who have served in an active capacity since 9/11. According to the Uniformed Service Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA), reservists who

are called to active duty have certain rights with respect to returning to their civilian jobs, when released from active duty. While there are a number of technicalities associated with this act, which was revised in 1994, essentially, reservists called to active duty have the right to expect to return to the same or similar position with the same pay and the same seniority once released from such active duty. This also includes and "escalator principle," which means that reservists will be treated the same as others who work for the company from which they came with respect to pay increases, benefits, etc. Unlike many other labor laws, the USERRA applies to all employers, without regard to number of employees.
