Speaker Walker Stapleton, Colorado Treasurer

Frank Middleton introduced Colorado State Treasurer, Walker Stapleton, who was sworn in as Colorado's 43rd State Treasurer on January 11, 2011, and has an impressive pedigree of education: a degree from Williams College in Massachusetts, a graduate of the London School of Economics, a Harvard MBA, to name a few. Prior to moving into the State Treasure position Walker served as CEO and CFO of various private and publicly traded companies. His extensive private sector background in finance has uniquely prepared him for the job of State Treasurer.

Mr. Stapleton admitted he worked hard on an optimistic speech for an Optimist Club, but it didn't happen. He told a story of his first days in office, hanging pictures on the walls. And then his assistant said that he was not to do this; he had



to call maintenance for that job. When maintenance came, he asked, "When will my pictures be hung?" The answer: "Oh, in about 10 or 12 days." Welcome to reality in the public sector.

He spoke of an \$18 billion budget, but his job is to manage a pool of \$7.5 billion to invest for safety and liquidity. He is also on the Board of Corrections and the Pension System. He described the pension system as unsustainable and not affordable. Mr. Stapleton spoke mostly from a position in the private sector, a refreshing concept.

Walker envisions a more fiscally responsible and effective state government. His priorities as Colorado's Treasurer are to safely and prudently invest Colorado's tax dollars, reform Colorado's PERA, and bring a higher level of accountability and transparency to government.
