Our Speaker, Bill Hanzlik Former Denver Nugget & Founder & CEO of Gold Crown Foundation

The Gold Crown Foundation was started in 1986 by Denver Nuggets player Bill Hanzlik and Colorado businessman Ray Barker. Ray wanted to start a basketball camp for youth players and went to Bill to ask if he would help. Bill, at the time was still playing and had small children so he declined, but Ray wouldn't stop. It wasn't until Ray asked about starting a girls' basketball camp that Bill agreed because there were so few opportunities for girls.

So the first basketball camp enrolled 150 girls and they were off and running. In the early 1990's school budgets were being cut and athletic programs for middle school students were vanishing, so Gold Crown started youth basketball leagues for all ages and skill levels.

Now they run leagues for over 400 teams. They have also added other sports such as volleyball, lacrosse and golf.

In 1998, Gold Crown teamed up with the Colorado Rockies and built the Coca-Cola All Star Baseball Park in Lakewood. They also acquired the old Alameda Junior High School with the idea of refurbishing it,

but plans quickly changed as the structure was scraped and a new 56,000 square foot field house was constructed in 2003. Also in 2003, they expanded their programming outside of sports by adding art and technology classes for kids. The coursework is flexible as they let the kids set the direction for what they want to learn.

All along the Gold Crown mission has been teaching life skills through sports and enrichment programing. Their guiding principle has been "What's best for the kid."

Their budget now tops 3.3 million dollars a year with about 55% of that funded by fees charged for the programs and the remainder is funded by sponsorships and donations.

Monaco South Optimist Club has committed to sponsoring a couple of scholarships for kids that otherwise

could not participate in the programs.

Thank you, Bill, for telling us about your foundation and all the work you do with our community's young people.
