

Speaker, Jan Haas, Moving Mountains - One Woman's Fight to Live Again

Speaker chair **Paul Bernard** introduced our speaker today Jan Haas, who tells her story as one woman's fight to live again.

After the birth of her third daughter, Jan Haas found herself back in the hospital fighting an invasive strep A infection. Thirty days and five abdominal surgeries later, she awakens in the ICU attached to a ventilator. Scared and confused, Jan must dig up the courage to breathe and walk again, regain her health, and trust in the community around her. The droning rhythm of two steps forward, one step back is a constant as Jan moves through her illness. Jan tells her emotional story in her book, *Moving Mountains*, published in 2011, developed from her journals, prose, and verse of how she and the community of love around her fought to live again.
