# Speaker, Jeremy Simon Life in Israel

**Paul Simon** introduces his son, <u>Jeremy</u>, who is here to speak about living in Israel. Jeremy graduated from CU and has lived in Israel for the past year.

Jeremy has been living in Tel Aviv, which is a secular.

vibrant city similar to Denver in population but in a much more dense concentration. The city has been described as a youthful, modern metropolis with a diverse population. Jeremy speaks about how neighborhoods are split into secular and strict religious sections and the two do not mix well. This concept is an entirely different set of structure that we are accustomed to here in Denver, but in Israel, it is an established reality with the consequences covered by local and international media. Security is much more open, with soldiers carrying automatic weapons but the atmosphere is not one of tension but positive energy.

Jeremy has done much traveling in Israel and explored areas that are important is

Ancient History. Cities such as Nazareth, and Jerusalem date to biblical times and the opportunity to visit should not be passed. The city of Aker, is one of the most well preserved ancient history sites he visited. Jeremy also had the

chance to travel to Jordan, where he stayed with the local Chief of Police, a man who had controlled security operations for major foreign dignitaries. The chief and Jeremy were able to discuss many of the issues specific to the

Middle East with an important perspective. He did not promote the fact that he was living in Israel and was treated well in Jordan. Jeremy also visited the West Bank, the scene of so much recent tension.

As Christmas approaches, Jeremy noted the influx of tourists to visit its significant religious sites. The architecture in many locations show an influence of biblical significance, many buildings can be identified by these styles. Israel is a beautiful country and its people feel a strong solidarity to the citizens of the United States. Their interest and curiosity about aspects of religion, and race and the ability to discuss these issues were noted by Jeremy.

President Paul tells the club Jeremy will be celebrating his birthday this coming Tuesday and the club serenades him. Happy Birthday Jeremy as only our club can do.
