This Weeks Speaker

Ms. Chris Sundberg, State Coordinator for History Day in Colorado

Chris was a little taken aback by our exuberance and confessed that she had no jokes to tell but was excited about our interest in History Day. Chris was proud to say that last year over 20,000 students, parents, and teachers attended History Day. The 2010 Program is "Innovation in History." There are 600 students from 10 regions participating. The presentations are divided into two divisions; grades 6-8 and 9-12. There are 5 levels of participation: 1. Performance, 2. Documentary, 3. Papers (individuals), 4. Exhibits, and 5. Web Pages, which is the most popular. In fact last year a Jeffco entry went to State Finals. One of the most interesting pieces the program offers is for a student to go into interesting class once a week and audit teachers and students to determine if they think they are really teaching material. Sadly, as a result of the current economic conditions History Day has lost most of their sponsorship for their Teaching Awards. As a result, most Primary Teaching Sources are at risk.

Chris also reported that Sargents School, located in Saugache County, had 132 students out of 157 that were coming to the History Day event. However, they are an underfunded school and lack enough money to make supplies and resources available to the kids. MSOC have contributed \$350 to their effort. It is the hope of this reporter that we are able to adopt this mighty little school and get every student to Denver for the History Day Event.
