### Happy Chanukah to all of our Jewish Friends

Every year between November and December, probably the best known Jewish holiday is celebrated. Chanukah (with various spellings) is also known as the festival of lights, because each night a new candle is lit on a special candelabra. Chanukah is an eight day festival beginning on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the Hebrew month, Kislev. Because the Hebrew months are based on the moon, and not the sun, Chanukah's place on the Secular calendar varies from year to year. Here is the story: Long, long ago, before your grandfather or your great-grandfather was ever born, in the land of Judea, there was a Syrian king named Antiochus. The king did not like the Jews, and ordered them to give up their God, their religion, their customs, and their beliefs. Antiochus wanted the Jews to worship the Greek gods. Now, the Jews did not like this, but they did as they were told, because they were afraid of the king. However, one Jew decided that he was not going to be bullied around by Antiochus and his army. This man's name was Judah Maccabee.

Judah and his brothers formed an army to fight back at Antiochus. They called themselves the "Maccabees" or "hammers." The Maccabees were vastly outnumbered but fought hard and after three years of "guerrilla fighting" they finally drove the Syrians out of Israel, reclaiming the Temple in Jerusalem. They began the long and hard task of cleaning up the temple and removing all the Greek symbols. On the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the month of Kislev, they finished the job and rededicated the temple. Then they wanted to relight the eternal light, other wise know as the N'er Tamid. The N'er Tamid is an oil lamp present in every Jewish house of worship, and once lit should never be extinguished. After the lamp was lit, it was realized that all the oil had been stolen or smashed by the Syrians and it would take 8 days to travel and get more. However, a miracle occurred, and the candle stayed lit eight days, until they could get more oil. Today, Jews celebrate Chanukah to mark the rededication of the temple, the victory over the Syrians, and the miracle of the N'er Tamid. The word Chanukah means "rededication" and the festival lasts eight days to mark the eight days over which the small amount of oil lasted.
