

Welcome to Our Super Citizen School Leadership

Robert Wardlaw & Jon Wachter

President Jon Wachter welcomed our Super Citizen School leadership to our breakfast and talked about the Super Citizen Program for the new school Year.

Robert Wardlaw provided a historical overview of the program going back to 1982 with a of three schools, Samuels, Southmoor, and Holm Elementary.

Since that time, it is estimated that close to 15,000 kids have being recognized, within the 10 schools (Bradley, Hamilton, Highline Academy, Holm, Lowry, McMeen, Most Precious Blood, Samuels, Slavens, and University Park), currently participating in this "Premier Activity" sponsored by Optimist

Club of Monaco South.



In sharing some highlights over the years, Mary Varveris assistant principal at McMeen Elementary told the members about a young student who struggled with school both in the classroom and socially. Having been able to turn his behavior and focus to more positive directions, he was named a Super Citizen and his emotional response was all you needed to see to understand what importance he gave to this award. He was supported at the assembly when receiving his Super Citizen Certificate and t-shirt by many of his family. Truly a wonderful story!

Melissa Hatchet, assistant principal at Slavens Elementary also had a very interesting story. She talked about a student that had severe behavioral problems as a kindergartner, having to be physically taken down the hall to the office. His behavior was very poor and it was discussed that he possibly was not ready for a normal school, but it

eventually improved. One of the signs of that improvement was him stating his desire for a goal of being named Super

Citizen. Melissa also mentions how that encouragement and recognition from a source other

> than parents and teachers recognizes student's for making good choices, and has a positive influence. Also special is the call she makes to families when they

> > learn of this presentation, often overcome with emotion as they are notified that their child has been chosen.

Steve Wera principal at Bradley International presented a

plague to our own President Jon, for his volunteer work at Bradley. Jon started an Optimist JOY club at Bradley and continues to spread the word in this young setting—making it cool to be in an Optimist crowd. Way to go Jon!

Steve also shared how the SC program gets the kids doing things right. Many times this program can be the turning point for a kid who is lacking a direction. He also mentioned the JOY club as being a way for kids to start thinking of the positive steps they can take to help themselves and others. This can make a big impact on a young person.

Dave Mann from Hamilton Middle School tells us about a student who after being recognized as a Super Citizen, mentions he feeling he is on his way in life. Somehow this award gets him to start thinking in terms of college and careers and is a stepping stone in that journey. Powerful stuff for those members listening. Continued on page 2
