Greg Young MSOC Treasurer

Greg Young presented the current MSOC budget and a compilation of last year's spending as opposed to the 2014-15 Budget. Last year we were at a deficit spending level of \$3,400, due in part to Christmas tree revenues \$5,000 below the preceding year. Member donations of \$6,000 helped offset any further losses. Meal Sales were down as was revenue but \$1,100 was added to the reserve account. The Club distributed \$31,000 to all our service projects and came within \$300 of budget. The Club continues to maintain a Reserve Account of \$40,000 and is in

solid financial condition. Excellent job everyone!
It was noted that this year we will have one extra day of sales for the Tree Lot. Through the hard work of **Cy Regan**, our Super Grocery Salesman we bring in \$200-300 per month, with the majority from King Soopers cards. It was pointed out that tips donated at the tree lot are for the Club Only and to that, **Tom**

Hoch admitted he probably owed the Club \$300. Postage costs are up 100% from \$46 to \$92 and Ron Cisco was speechless. He did say however, that he mailed his dues and that is probably why it has not arrived yet. Greg being ever the gentleman did not disclose who has yet to pay their dues, but stated Guido is lurking about just in case. There is a link on the GUMS email distribution page to the full financial report.

New Board member **Tom Glazier** made a sincere statement reflecting how impressed he was with the quality and exper-

tise of the work Greg performs for the Club and the District. A hearty round of applause followed. Greg was ever the grateful guy, and proudly reported he has passed four out of his last five lie detector tests.

We all are eternally grateful to Greg for his dedication and attention to watching over the Clubs and the Districts finances.
