

Denver School Board Candidate Anne Rowe

Our Guest Speaker was Denver School Board Candidate Anne Rowe, introduced by Paul Bernard.

A Denver native, Anne is a smallbusiness owner, with 20 years in publishing and 10 years in the legal placement and concierge business. She is a graduate of Stanford University and earned her MBA at the University of Denver.

Anne has lived in southeast Denver with her husband Frank and their daughters Kate, Tory and Biz, since 1990. All three girls are graduates of Slavens K-8 and have attended/are attending George Washington High School. For the 2011-2012 school year, Kate will be a freshman at Occidental College in Los Angeles, Tory will be junior at GW and Biz will be a freshman there. (Editor's Note: at least one of her daughters was a super Citizen at Slavens!)

Anne comes by her passion for public service naturally, having grown up watching her father, Jim Bye, a community leader in Denver for more than 50 years. "Growing up in my house, with my parents, public service was a way of life. They were involved in the community in so many ways and it just became a part of who I am," says Anne.

nonprofit community boards that address the needs of Denver's kids. Her involvement at the school level began 16 years ago when she became part of the group of neighborhood parents who worked

In addition, Anne served as co-chair of the Patriot Partners at George Washington High School, was a founding co-chair and executive board member of A+ Denver, is a member of the Partnership for Southeast Denver Schools (PSEDS) and is currently a member of the Superintendent's Parent Forum.

Anne also share the good news/bad news with us. Good News: data collected from 2005 through 2010 showed that DPS enrollment is up

from 72,000 to 80,000 now, achievement is growing, and more kids are graduating. The Bad News: only 52% of High School students are graduating, and the achievement gap is much too large. She readily admits that there is a lot of work to do, and knows that she is the ideal candidate to remediate the Bad News while still improving the Good News.
