#### Brent's Place

Brent's place is a hospitality house for children with cancer and their families for use while the child is being treated. The kids come to Brent's after receiving a bone marrow transplant. The facility was established in 1998 at 17th and Park with four fully furnished and equipped apartments. The facility has grown since then and now has eleven apartments located just a few blocks from Children's Hospital and the Rocky Mountain Cancer Center. The average stay is 59 days. Children come to Brent's Place after receiving stem cell transplantation. The stem cells can come from bone marrow, peripheral blood, or occasionally, umbilical cord blood. A stem cell transplant allows a patient to be treated with high doses of drugs, radiation, or both. The hope is that the high doses will kill the leukemia cells. According to our speaker, Adell Gefand, leukemia is by far the most prevalent type of cancer among children ... almost 80%. With earlier detection and better treatment, the number of children who survive is increasing. Ms. Gefand said they can always use a good handyman, so if you have those skills you may want to consider volunteering some time to a very worthy cause.


