Larry has two children in DPS. His son is at Samuels Elementary and the proud owner of four Super Citizen shirts!

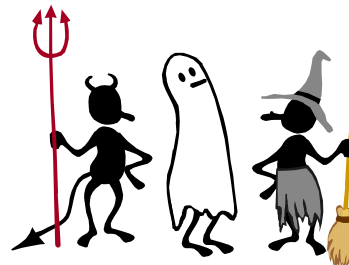
