Program for Today, Harry Fegley

Our speaker today was member **Harry Fegley**, who on "*The Other Side of Africa*." Harry and his wife Linda have traveled extensively, and enjoyed many parts of the world. Their time in Africa has been memorable.

In 1990 Harry and Linda spent time in Nepal, in part conducting leadership training seminars for locals. They met another couple from the United States in one city and enjoyed dinner with them and becoming acquainted. They returned in 1999, conducting seminars in Katmandu and it was during this time that the Maoist Revolution broke out. It was after this visit, that Harry was approached to do similar seminars in Africa.

After initially declining the chance to visit Uganda, Harry and Linda accepted the opportunity after consulting with people in the State Department. In the village where they stayed, the Fegley's stayed in the nicest building within many miles. During their 3 week stay they conducted training classes and helped the villagers with

aspects of time management and leadership development. Harry showed slides of his room, the bed decorated elaborately, and then another showing a mosquito netting that is a requirement in this part of the world. During this time, they were involved with several projects. The Goat Project involved giving a villager a goat and allowing them to care for the animal for a year with all aspects of the animal's care being the individuals' responsibility. Many individuals flourish in this environment and are rewarded for their work. Others, don't fare as well and some fail, but the results show how training can benefit long-term plans. The local population is extremely poor and for most of us, this kind of life is unimaginable. Harry displayed a slide of the cooks who worked over an open flame, where they were conducting the seminars, they were dressed in their best clothes and tried to provide, as well as they could, for their guests. Harry also talked about the Timothy Project which was for orphans whose families had been wiped out by the battles in the region. Some of these children had made a fourteen hour trip to the location to participate in this program, which included volunteer work in the community. One of the aspects Harry required of his class attendees, was that they use the skills they were being taught and tangible follow up documentation was recorded.

Harry talked about an elementary school attended by 3,000 children and the stark conditions they were exposed to. Despicable poverty with no running water, indoor plumbing, and lack of resources were common conditions. The Peace Project was started by one woman, who mediated between two warring tribes who fought over food. Because of her efforts, an agricultural project that benefited over 40,000 people of the two tribes has been undertaken. Funds from the European Union has helped further these projects and continues to benefit the people of the region.

Harry talked more about the reasons for the continued struggles of the people in Uganda and Africa. A <u>Wall Street Journal</u> article entitled, "Why Isn't Aid Working?" was discussed. Corruption, no accountability, and lack of follow up are some of the reasons for years of contributions and billions of dollars in aid has resulted in so little progress. Even suggestions of some sort of benevolent dictatorship being the best environment for the continent were talked about.

Thank you Harry for a very interesting presentation!
