Brain Bowl is Coming: When Karl Geil is excited, you know the Brain Bowl is near. He wants us to reserve some



time next January and February to work on the upcoming Brain Bowl. For those new members, the Brain Bowl is

an academic completion for middle school students. It is pattern after the old G.E. College Bowl where teams from various schools compete against each other by answering questions in a variety of subjects. There are three regional competitions capped by a Colorado/Wyoming District championship. Approximately 1,250 students will participate in this event, and we need about 135 volunteers at each tournament to make them run properly. There are volunteer opportunities for Readers (training in advance required), Time Keepers, Score Keepers, Runners, Score Checkers, Proctors for the written test, and many more. Reader training has not yet been scheduled. The tournaments are:

- Central Region February 1, 2014 at Heritage High School in Littleton.
- South Region February 8, 2014 at Carson Middle School on the Ft. Carson U.S. Army Post near Colorado Springs.
- Championship Tournament February 22, 2014 at Hamilton Middle School in Denver.
- North Region Not yet scheduled. The schools up north are still recovering from the Fall floods
