

Craig Eley It Ain't Broke—Let's Fix It A Vison for the Future

New **President Craig Eley** did not introduce our speaker this morning because he said our speaker needed no introduction. In fact, our speaker was Craig Eley. Craig delivered his equivalent to the State of the Union address. We'll call it his State of the Club address.

The Optimist Club of Monaco South is starting its fifth decade of service. This is an achievement of which we can all be proud, especially those five members, Greg Hurd, Ralph Pedersen, John Young, Oscar Sorensen and Kent Gloor, along with our

founder was Dr. **Ed Fankhauser**, who were present at the Club's inception. So, how are we doing?

Monaco South is the largest Club in our district. Indeed, the latest statistics from Optimist international show that we are the 12th largest Optimist Club. We stand at 131 members and 5 Friends of Optimism, for a total of 136. If we had 10 more members, we would be the 10th largest Optimist club in the world.

Our budget is the envy of most other clubs. When we add dues, tree lot income, Rockies game income, grocery card sales, entertainment book sales, peach sales, and contributions, we take in over \$50,000 a year.

Anyway, by all measures things are going swimmingly at Monaco South. Well, maybe. But I believe that if a group like ours is not moving forward, it is in danger of falling behind.

So I propose this sentiment to keep in mind for the next year: It Ain't Broke—Let's Fix It!

I have a number of goals to make our Club better over the next 12 months, goals which I hope will be realized and will make our Club better for the next 12 years or longer. (Editor, to see these goals, read Craig's entire talk on GUMS distribution email.)

Like national presidential candidates, it's easy for me to say what I would like to accomplish when the reality is I cannot accomplish these things merely because I want to. It takes all of you to buy in and to help out.

But one thing I can accomplish on my own involves Camaraderie Day. I believe personal connections between members are formed, in large part, by the conversations we have with one another at the table. Most Fridays, we only get a few minutes before the business of the Club and the speaker intervenes. But one day a month is set aside for fellowship, with no scheduled speaker. I consider that time together to be of the highest importance, inviolable and invaluable to our Club.

Therefore, on Camaraderie Day, after the invocation, pledge and introduction of guests, there will be no announcements from this podium until 7:30. We will then have Club announcements. This means we will need to start our sign-up sheets circulating before having the chance to explain them, but it's just once a month.

Editor: No question about it, the Optimist Club of Monaco South is great. The challenge will be to make it even greater. President Craig does not believe in the saying, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it." He believes that we cannot get complacent and fall into a belief that the club is a well-oiled machine and will perpetuate itself. All of us must continue to work at improving the club by sharing the experience of optimism with others; by looking for new ideas for projects; by keeping in contact with members that we haven't seen recently; by mentoring new members; by each of us making the effort to meet the new members and help them to get involved and by identifying and developing tomorrow's club leaders.

President Craig would like to improve and strengthen each of these areas. We have no doubt that he and his very capable new Board of Directors will do just that but they need our help and support. So don't just get into a groove of sitting back and watching, ask how you can get more involved. If you have an idea for a project bring it up and help make it happen. Only if we all continue to work at improving the club will it stay vibrant.
