Guest Speaker, Candidate for Mayor, Michael Hancock

Two-term City Council District 11 member and Candidate for Mayor, Michael Hancock was introduced and thanked **Paul Bernard, John Stoffel** and the rest of the Club for allowing him to be our speaker this morning.

He talked about his family background, past political activity and business experience. As a Denver native and the 10th child of 10 brothers and sisters including 3 sets of twins, he stressed his experience at mediation and idea sharing. He attended Manuel High School and let us all know his wife was from our own T.J. High School.

Michael focused on his ability to work with City agencies, foreclosure matters and business development, especially companies looking at Denver that include Brazil, Australia and Japan. His commitment to zero tolerance for allowing any student to fail in school was based on an experience he had with a trade representative from Japan. The reason the Japanese company would not choose Denver was because of the low academic and competitive standards set by DPS. As Mayor he would work to change that problem.

When asked about the Douglas County voucher program he decline to make a commitment, but stated firmly he is opposed to the DPS practice of "Direct Placement" of unqualified teachers throughout the district, especially his. He went on to say he had no problem with tenured teachers, but it was almost impossible to remove a teacher once they earned tenure.

As for budget issues, he said the city was facing a \$100 million deficit and the Department of Safety was going to be trimmed by \$24 million and 100 jobs eliminated. The atmosphere at Safety, regarding the time it takes in resolving disciplinary matters is unacceptable and changes needed to be made. However, he did say that he felt 99% of the Police Force to be good, hard working and loyal officers. Regarding the pay increase approved by City Council he supported the decision and said it was just a tiny drop in the bucket of the big financial picture. He noted it is required by City Charter for Council to make such decisions for future administrations. The Pension Funds are sound but needs a little adjustment every year to stay in balance. The 5 furlough days required of all city employees are part of that process. There was a question about the punitive aspect of the new additional \$50 head tax and he agreed it was something that needed "to be looked at."

Gangs and safety in LoDo was a matter he felt was of great concern and he will work to crack down on miscreants and direct funds to the D.A's office to help prosecute RICO violations and related activities. Michael also is confident the Bronco's will play this year. There was no discussion concerning the Rockies, Nuggets or Avalanche.

In closing Michael Hancock thanked the group for our hospitality and energetic conversation. **President Ed** then presented him an Optimist cup complete with the Optimist Creed on the back and suggested he read it to City Council and get them squared away. It was an interesting and educational presentation and we all thank Michael for his words and camaraderie.
