Final Christmas Tree Lot Report: The Tree Czar. Joe Marci, reported that we sold 1,256 trees, over 1,000 feet of Garland and 300 wreaths. The most sold tree was the Noble Fir at 375 followed by Fraser Fir at 243. Finishing way back (in fact, last) was Concolor at 23. Did we even have Concolor? Editor: I'm told they got mixed up with the Canaan Firs. So here are the differences:



Concolor Fir is a soft, long-needled fir. Its open branching allows for a good number and size of decorations, while its long needles provide fullness and a dense appearance. The Concolor's

citrus-like scent makes it a pleasing tree for indoors. It can retain its needles for several weeks.



Canaan Fir, also called West Virginia balsam fir. is a little known tree that is native to isolated pockets in the mountains of West Virginia and Virginia. Some have suggested that, during the last glacial period, a continuous fir pop-

ulation extended from North Carolina north along the Appalachian mountain range into Canada.

The Brain Bowl is Coming Our own Karl Geil

Karl Geil was our speaker this morning as he gave an extended report on the upcoming Brain Bowl. This project was started in 1983 by the Buckingham Optimist Club (now the Gateway Optimist Club). In the 1990's, the original project chairman left the project and it began to dwindle. Monaco South adopted the project at that time and it has since grown to involve some 60 different schools entering over 200 teams involving over 1,000 students.

It is an academic competition much like the old GE College Bowl. For you youngsters, Karl calls it Jeopardy with teams. Students participate with teams in the 6th, 7th and 8th Grade age groups.

Every school in the states of Colorado and Wyoming is invited to enter teams. There are now 3 different regional tournaments and a district wide championship tournament. The dates for the tournaments are: Northern Region is on January 12th at Monarch High School in Louisville; the Central Region is at Littleton High School on January 26th; the South Region is at Carson Middle School in Colorado Springs on February 9th

with the Championship Tournament set for February 23rd at Douglas County High School.

About 35 Optimist Clubs supply volunteers to work these competitions but Monaco South is the "heavy lifter" club. This project won an Optimist International award for multi-club sponsored projects. They are in need of volunteers to act as readers, proctors, runners, score keepers, time keepers and administrative personnel. Readers need to attend a special training session prior to the competitions.
