

Our Speaker Today - Karl Geil The Brain Bowl is Coming!

Speaker today was our own **Karl Geil**, who filled us in on the particulars of the 2012 Brain Bowl. After showing a brief video of Channel 2's coverage of a



past Brain Bowl, Karl announced that this year's event will be bigger and better than ever. There will be three regional events, and new this year, a championship round, which will feature the top six teams for each grade from the regional contests.

As Karl is fond of stating, "For those of you

who are not familiar with the Brain Bowl, it's like Jeopardy with teams." Each team of five students competes with other teams in their grade level (6th, 7th, or 8th), answering general knowledge questions appropriate for their respective ages. Teams advance on the basis of points accumulated during morning rounds, with teams from each of the three levels going on to the head on head competition held in the afternoon.

Approximately 1,000 to 1,200 students will be participating in the various regions this year, which means each regional competition will require some 135-150 Optimist volunteers. Various jobs, including readers, scorekeepers, timekeepers, test proctors are available and no prior experience is required. Training is held for most jobs the morning of the competition. In order to ensure top quality, those who wish to be readers must attend approximately 2 hours of training prior to reading in any competition.

This is one of the premier events in the Colorado/ Wyoming District and was supported last year by members of 35 of the 61 clubs currently in the District.

The event has won the prestigious "Community Projects Award" at the international level and is well known throughout Optimist International as well as the middle school educational community in Colorado and Wyoming.

Monaco South Optimist Club is one of the strongest supporters of this event in providing both funding and volunteers. In addition, **Tom Mauro** should be recognized for his efforts in rejuvenating the Brain Bowl, which was in serious danger of disappearing after
