
# Weekly Drawing

# Familiar Optimist International (OI) Terms

New members (and sometimes Old Members) are not always familiar with some of the terms often used by those who have been around Optimism for any period. For your delight and edification, here are some explanations of acronyms and terms:

- ♦ **OI**: Optimist International (The administrative body headquartered in St. Louis, MO.
- OI Foundation: Organization that funds oratorical, essay and other scholarships. Contributions to the OI Foundation are tax deductible. (Contributions to most Optimist Clubs are not.)
- Optimist International Mission: "By providing hope and positive vision, Optimists bring out the best in kids."
- ♦ OI Motto: "Friend of Youth."
- Colorado/Wyoming District: One of 53 Districts in Optimist International currently consists of 51 clubs and about 1700 members lead by the District Governor. There are 52 clubs in Colorado and One club in Cheyenne Wyoming.
- Zone: A zone is a segment of a district consisting of 5 -7 clubs, usually in the same geographic area and lead by a Lt. Governor. There are currently 11 zones in the Colorado/Wyoming District.
- Brain Bowl: An academic competition open to middle school students in Colorado and Wyoming. Teams of up to five students compete answering general knowledge questions. One of the best-supported activities in the District.
- Oratorical Contest: This contest is open to all students under the age 18 and provides an opportunity to

improve public speaking skills. Competition starts at the
club level and winners advance to higher levels by giving
a four to five minute oral presentation. The District winner
is awarded a \$2500 scholarship.

- ♦ Essay contest: Competition starts at the club level. Participants advance by writing 400-500 word essays on a topic selected by Optimist International on an annual basis. District winner is awarded a \$2500 scholarship.
- Communications Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH): Using the same topic as the Oratorical Contest, this contest allows those who cannot hear the opportunity to communicate, either through oral presentation or signing. Winners of District competition receive a \$2500 scholarship.
- JOOI Clubs: Junior Optimist Octagon International: Designed to teach students the importance of service to community these clubs work in association with Optimist Clubs in performing service projects. There are 3 levels of JOOI clubs: Alpha Clubs for elementary schools. Junior Optimist Club for middle schools and Octagon Clubs for High schools.
- Childhood Cancer Campaign (CCC): Charity officially sanctioned by Optimist International and supported through individual contributions from various members throughout the organization. Supports research and treatment of childhood cancer.
- Friend of Optimism (FOO): Generally, honorary members of an Optimist Club who may not be active in attending club meetings, but generally support the purposes of Optimism by sponsoring events, contributing funds, and assisting in activities.
