OUR SPEAKERS TODAY: Susan Gustin, Colorado History Day

Our speaker today was **Susan Gustin**, Asst. State Coordinator for Colorado History Day. Colorado History Day is the local competition for National History Day, which is a year long program. The mission of



National History Day is to improve the teaching and learning of history in elementary and secondary schools so that students become better prepared, knowledgeable citizens. For nearly 30 years, Colorado History Day has been fostering history education in grades 6 through 12. By providing teacher resources and statewide contests, over 1000 kids can participate in a fun and educational learning experience.

Kids in this program learn to do historical research by digging into original documents, and doing original discovery in an area defined by an annual theme. This year's theme is The Individual in History: Actions and Legacies. Examples of individuals who cared deeply about a cause and nudged history forward are Eleanor Roosevelt in her quest for human rights, John Peter Zenger and the fight for freedom of the press, and Walter Reed in his quest for a cure for yellow fever. The list can extend exponentially. Individuals who were activists, world leaders, scientists, or artists followed their fervor and focused their life's work that eventually became a catalyst for events to unfold in history. In each case the decisions and the route that the individual followed ignited a change. An example right here in Colorado is Kit Carson, and the influence he brought to Fort Garland and the San Luis Valley.

Students can participate in five categories: Documentary, Exhibit, Written Paper, Performance, or

Web Site. Susan showed us some pictures of past exhibits...one very clever one using a garbage can as a rotating display on the far reaching effects of agent orange from the Viet Nam war.

663 Colorado kids competed at the state level last year with 65 going to National. On of our kids got 3rd in Web site design and four all together won prizes.

Denver History Day is April 4th, and if you want to get involved contact Becky Muggli, Regional Coordinator, at becky_muggli@dpsk12.edu or **Karl Geil.**

On May 2nd, Judges are needed for Colorado History Day, and Susan handed out sign up form. If you missed it, call **Karl Geil** and he can get you the information or call Susan at 303-556-6647. Training is 2 hours on April 21 or 25 and the event will last about 5 hours. All you need is common sense and willingness to affirm the participant's desire and enthusiasm for history. Let's all sign up to support this get kids event!! Food is provided!!
