

Her life and the life of her family followed in a major turn for the good. She also found her profound experience helped to energize her club. She took less than a half dozen sentences to move the entire group. Our presidents, past and new: Jean Claude "JC" St-Onge, past; Ron Huxley, present; and Ken Garner, elect; did us proud. The new OI President Elect Ken Garner gave a very stirring speech. He explained the criteria that will be used this year to identify the top club in optimism. Winton Train Holocaust Survivor Visitor: John Oss introduced Tom Graumann. Tom was one of the 669 children rescued from Slovakia, now the Czech Republic, in August 1939.

The year was 1939, and 29-year-old British stockbroker Nicholas Winton was set to leave for Switzerland on a ski holiday when he answered his phone. It was a friend conducting humanitarian aid in Prague, Czechoslovakia. This friend described the refugee camps in which he worked, and asked Winton to abandon his holiday, come to Prague, and lend a hand.

Englishman Nicholas Winton took three weeks from work in December 1938 to conclude a rescue from the Nazis. He collected contributions of fifty pounds sterling per child, arranged for papers for each child to immigrate to England, scheduled a train, and found English families to take the children. The Czech families recognized the dire need, accepted the recue offer, and sent their children to

Tom was one of those children. All of Tom's family was wiped out. The faiths of children, adopting families, and Winton included agnostic, Jew, and Christian. All of the children were judged Jew by the Nazis. Winton celebrated his 105<sup>th</sup> birthday May 19, 2014 with about a hundred people in the Czech embassy in London.

Tom has put the mistakes of the past behind him and pressed on. John said he never expects to meet a greater optimist example than Tom. Tom has been a great inspiration for many here and in Europe. He speaks multiple languages. He has recounted his story in German classrooms, but more commonly in Czech and US assemblies. His story is briefly told in a trifold brochure. # Our Speaker, Donna Priester & Paul Simon

You are an "Optimist Leader"

**Donna Priester**, a member of Colorado Springs Academy Club and past governor of the CO/WY District and our own past president, **Paul Simon** spoke today on leadership in Optimism. Paul started the program by saying that it is no surprise to anyone that Optimist Clubs, as with many civic organizations, are "Aging Out," i.e., the average age is increasing annually. This means that either we are not recruiting younger members, or those that we are recruiting are not staying with the program. A corollary to this is that many of the members have already held leadership positions, so while it is not too difficult to staff the activities in which we participate, it is extremely hard to find people willing to assume the leadership positions in our organization, from the Governor down to committee chairs. Everyone is willing to participate, but nobody wants to lead.

Donna commented that while we are all more than willing to do things for kids, it seems nobody wants to put the

time and effort into organizing these activities. Donna recognized **John Young** as one of those who is willing to give the extra effort by awarding him the <u>Professional Growth and Involvement (PGI) Level 7 Award</u>, which is a gold backing for his Optimist Pin. PGI is the Optimist International program, which reflects degree of participation in Optimist Activities, including recruiting new members. Only an elite few achieve the Level 7 and John should be congratulated for

this achievement.

Donna also said that although programs such as PGI recognized people for their activities, most people were not striving for recognition but for self-fulfillment through helping others. Donna also talked about the importance of multi club activities and how clubs should work together to ensure enough resources to carry out our programs with excellence and gave such examples as the Optimist Junior World Golf Tournament, the Brain Bowl, the Santa Train and others, in which several or many clubs participated to make these events successful.

However, all this takes time and effort to organize, so it is really important that we all participate, not only at the 'doer' level, but also as leaders willing to give that extra effort to ensure success. "If not you, then who."

Donna mentioned the election of the new President of Optimist International was a great inspiration for the future, as the gentleman elected is in his 40's. Ken Garner will bring a refreshing new perspective on Optimism and we need to follow his lead in modernizing the functioning of all of our clubs, including the use of various social media. To this end, the Colorado/Wyoming website is currently being updated to be as up to date as possible.

The message conveyed by both Donna and Paul was that the "Leaders of Optimism are you." Whether at the District Level, as a Club President or Secretary/Treasurer or as a Committee Chair, the only way our organization will continue to be successful in serving youth is if we have the leadership to ensure not only success, but excellence.
