Tomorrow's Flowers Elder Care

The speaker for the day was our own **David Lararoff**. David is in the process of putting together a new residential care facility for the elderly called "*Tomorrow's Flowers*," located at 3001 South Dexter Way in the University Hills area. The inspiration for this endeavor is his friendship with Carl, a retired psychologist with Alzheimer's. Carl is no longer able to stay alone and David has taken responsibility for his care.

David's plan is to create a facility for 10-12 elderly people which is a residence environment, not an institution, where the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs of the residents can be met. He has named this project "Tomorrow's Flowers." David has received great support form the University Hills Home Owners Association which is holding a zoning meeting Monday night June 16th to approve his project.
