Annual Super Citizen Trip Continued

Some of the lucky Super Citizens from Samuels, Slavens, Holm, University Park, McMeen, Lowry elementary; Bradley International; and Hamilton Middle School, who participated in Expedition Health at the Museum of Nature and Science on April 9th. All of this was arranged and coordinated by Don Thomson. Assisting Don on the outing was Tom McKee and Don St. John.





In the late 1970's John F. Brensike, a physician conducting heart disease research at the National Institutes of Health in Washington, D.C., became involved in cholesterol screenings. As he traveled the country, he observed a high level of interest from communities to provide screening services. However he noted that few screenings were available and the quantity varied. But more importantly, he noted that there was follow-up to the community.

From there, Dr. Brensike started the National Health Screening Council for Volunteer Organizations (NHSCVO) as a means of promoting preventative health maintenance. Through this organization, the health fair concept was born. The idea was presented by NHSCVO to interested communities across the country. In Colorado, NHSCVO approached Al Flanagan, then president KBTV Channel 9 in Denver, now 9NEWS. The television station recognized this effort's value to the community and agreed to provide both financial and media support to help launch the first health fair. All this is to get you ready to help work the up coming 9NEWS Health Fair. We work at Schlessman YMCA on Sunday, April 19th at 7:00 am. **Howard Fry** leads this project.
