This exciting event includes a continental breakfast and speakers who will address Fraud Prevention and active aging.

## Our Speaker for Today

**Kale Smith** introduces our speaker this morning. **Doug Smith** is Senior Public Affairs Officer from the Social Security Administration.

In 1935 the Social Security Administration (SSA) was established. SSA is an independent agency of the federal government that administers Social Security, a social insurance program consisting of retirement, disability, and survivors benefits. To qualify for these benefits workers pay Social Security taxes on their earnings; future benefits are based on the employees' contributions.

Doug talked about the current state of Social Security and how it is trying to keep up with the increasing case load. As the country's population grows older, the need for this organization's resources becomes more important. The SSA estimates in the coming years as many as 10,000 Americans a day will be applying for benefits.

To help with this process, SSA has developed a new website that makes it easier to contact and keep



informed about the status of benefits. On it, a person can apply for benefits, check status of the application, learn about business services and

much more. To get to this website go to <http://www.ssa.gov/>.

Historically, Americans have relied on SSA as a major portion of their retirement planning income, along with savings and pensions they may have contributed to. Currently, Colorado has 464,000 residents that receive benefits from SSA.

Doug also mentioned the Social Security Disability insurance program that pays benefits to you and certain family members if you have worked long enough. Your adult child may also qualify for benefits on your earnings record if he or she has a disability that started before age 22. The Supplemental Security Income pays benefits to disabled adults and children who have limited income and resources. SSI benefits are also payable to people over 65 without disabilities who have met the financial limits.

Some who retire choose to return to work and pay back the money they have received to SSA and retire at a later time, receiving full benefits. This was an excellent presentation and pertinent for all members to learn about.
