Attending the British Open

The British Open was played, as any avid golfer will know, at Carnoustie Links Course in Carnoustie, Scotland. It was the 6th time the British Open has been played there. What you might not know is that MSOC member Wyatt McCallie was there to watch. This morning Wyatt spoke of his experience and a bit about the tournament and events that occurred at the diabolical 18th hole where Wyatt was in the stands to watch the drama play out. Running down the entire left side of the 18th is the Barry Burn, a small creek, and a huge contributor to the 4.611 average score on the hole. Padraig Harrington, the eventual winner, made a mess of the hole by going into Barry Burn not once but twice on his final round and carding a double bogey. Harrington's double left the door open for Sergio Garcia who missed a 10 foot putt that would have given him



his first major championship. Garcia then lost in the four hole playoff and Harrington was the one to lift the Claret Jug and take home the \$1,542,450 first place money. As a small consolation, Sergio took home \$925,470 for his efforts. The numbers are a bit strange but I assume that is the result of making the EURO to Dollar conversion.
