<u>Super Citizen Program</u>: Monaco South Optimist Club distributes "Super Citizen Awards" to students in 10 elementary schools in the Southeast Metro



Area each month of the school year. At the end of the year, one Super Citizen is selected as the most outstanding and receives the **Charlie Korsoski** Memorial Award, which includes a special

certificate and a \$100 U.S. Savings Bond. The award is a memorial to **Charlie Korsoski**, who was instrument-al in establishing the Super Citizen Program in 1982 with several other members. Upon his death in 1992 (at the age of 84), the club voted to create the award now presented in his name. While many of our members participate in this program as presenters and photographers, those who deserve special recognition are: **Don Thomson** – Chairman, who spends countless hours on the administration of

this program. Thanks, in great measure, to Don's competent leadership, this program received first place in the Optimist International Community Projects Award for 2007. **Merlin Kent** – Historian, who has been with the program since its inception and keeps

Bob Finkelmeier – Designs and prints certificates to be presented to the students we honor (more than 680 just this year), Don St. John, Mark Goodbody, Greg Young and Wyatt McCallie – Photographers who can be counted upon to record the Super Citizens for history.

Hamilton Middle School Reading Program: At Hamilton Middle School's Awards Nights this year, Karl Geil and Tom Mauro presented the Accelerated Reader Awards to Hamilton's students. During the school year, the kids read age-appropriate novels, take a reading comprehension test on the books in the Accelerated Reader computer program, and accumulate points during the year based on how well they perform on the tests. Students who accumulate at least 500 points (the equivalent of reading about 3 million words) earn a \$100.00 U.S. Savings Bond. Last year, a record 40 students earned a Savings Bond, so our Board of Directors budgeted for 40 again this year. So, of course, the record was broken this year when 72 students earned a Savings Bond. The 32 over and above what we had in our budget were paid for by Hamilton Middle School.
