

"The emergency in Sudan's western region of Darfur presents the starkest challenge to the world since the Rwanda genocide in 1994. A <u>government-backed</u> Arab militia known as Janjaweed has been engaging in campaigns to displace and wipe out communities of African tribal farmers.....Lives are hanging in the balaance on a massive scale."

CCGAA is a coalition of many organizations in Colordo focused on stopping genocide. Some of the organizations involved are: American Jewish Committee, Archdiocese of Denver, Colorado Council of Churches, Interfaith Alliance, and Urban League of Metro Denver.

Voices from Darfur

"The problem of Darfur began with Arabs coming and attacking villages. When you were going to school they would stop and ask you, 'Where are you going?' I would say, 'I am going to school.' They would say, 'We are going to stop you. Why do you need to go to school?' Since I was a child they have been asking, 'Are you Fur? (Fur means slave) They say that we are like slaves, that they need to remove the Fur. They want to kill us because we are black. This land before belonged to the Fur tribe or other minority peoples in Darfur, but they say no, this Fur land is Arab land."
