## Acupuncture

Our speaker was Dr. Ko Ying Chen who uses the traditional Chinese medical technique of acupuncture to help resolve problems with smoking, weight loss, insomnia, headaches, back problems and numerous other ailments. Acupuncture is a traditional Chinese medical technique for unblocking chi by inserting needles at particular points on the body to balance the opposing forces of yin and yang. Chi is an energy that allegedly permeates all things. It is believed to flow through the body along 14 main pathways called meridians. When yin and yang are in harmony, chi flows freely within the body and a person is healthy. When a person is sick, diseased, or injured, there is an obstruction of chi along one of the meridians. Traditional Chinese medicine has identified some 500 specific points where needles are to be inserted for specific effects. With the aid of the needles, the body can be used to heal itself. The practice of acupuncture is thought to be between 2000 and 5000 years old.
