Speaker

Our very own **Karl Geil** was our guest speaker today to discuss the <u>BRAIN BOWL</u>. What is the Brain Bowl? According to Karl, it's similar to the old GE College Bowl (Jeopardy for teams) it's a one day event for grades 6-8. There is one written round, and 3-4 head-to-head verbal rounds in the morning.

Total points scored in the morning determines which 24 teams (8 per grade level) continue in the afternoon. The afternoon consists of single-elimination, head- to-head competitions leading up to a championship round at each grade level.

Every public and private school in Colorado and Wyoming which serves grades 6, 7, and 8th graders is invited to compete. There are 3 tournaments (4 next year), and schools are assigned to a venue based upon geographic location, and each school may register up to three teams per grade.

This is a HUGE EVENT! In the North Region, there are 56 teams currently registered and are expecting at least 42 more. This tournament capped at 100 teams. For the Central Region, 77 teams are currently registered, and are expecting at least 19 more. This tournament capped at 100 teams. For the South Region, there are 36 teams currently registered, and we expecting at least 6 more. This tournament capped at 60 teams.

Each Venue needs 135 Volunteers: Readers, Proctors, Time Keepers, Score Keepers, Runners, and More! Please sign-up and participate in this award-winning, fun-packed
