

head as a son of a excruciating. For awhile as he lay on the street, he could not move his legs or fingers, and Oscar admits that at that moment he was not thinking only of the best and was not expecting the best. In fact he was thinking of the worst of the worst. But as Tom called 911, feeling and movement slowly returned and Oscar was back to being his optimistic self.

Oscar was hauled off to the ER by ambulance, where he was diagnosed with a hip contusion, a sprained wrist, and painful elbow and shoulders. He received a brain MRI, was told he had one, and was released. He is scheduled to un-

dergo imaging of his shoulders to determine if there is anything structurally wrong.

Although still in some pain, Oscar says he is thankful to be able to move and promises to be so strong that nothing will disturb his peace of mind when we see him at our next Friday meeting.
