History of Korsoski Super Citizen

The Optimist Club of Monaco South is very proud to present this award in fond memory of Charlie Korsoski. Charlie originated the Super Citizenship program in 1982. The program began with only three elementary schools in Southeast Denver; Samuels, Southmoor and Holm. It later expanded to include Bradley International School, Most Precious Blood Catholic School, Hamilton Middle School in 1988, McMeen Elementary in 1992, Slavens Elementary and University Park Elementary in 2007, and Lowry Elementary in 2008.

Charlie was indeed a FRIEND OF YOUTH. The purpose of the Super Citizenship award is to reward good citizenship of students before their peers. Recipients are chosen by their teacher for improvement in academic grades, social skills, attitude, academic growth, good attendance, courtesy, helpfulness, conneration, and improved behavioral skills. The

cooperation, and improved behavioral skills. The Super Citizenship award includes a framed certificate, signed by the teacher, principal, Optimist Club of Monaco South club president, Mayor of Denver, and Chief of Police. A special "I AM A SUPER CITIZEN" T-shirt is also given out to each child during the assembly.

The Super Citizenship program received the special project award from Optimist International in 2007. The program has become the flagship project for the Optimist Club of Monaco South for its 26 years of dedication to the youth of Denver. The Club has issued an average of 540 awards each school year to students in these 9 schools.

Sadly, Charlie Korsoski passed away in January 1992, at the age of 84, but the program continues and includes many Optimist volunteers. Special recognition goes to Mr. Marlin Kent, who along with Charlie, kept records and took the picture of each student. These photos are given to the student and school. Mr. Gerald Davis willingly took over as coordinator of the program from 1992 to 2002, and still is an active volunteer in the program. Mr. Don Thomson is the current coordinator. Other fellow Optimists who give much time to the success of the program include Messrs. Marc Goodbody and Don St. John who share all the photography and development
