There are 32 teams currently in the NFL and, to date, there have been 47 Super Bowls played. Of the 32 NFL teams, 4 have NEVER played in a Super Bowl: Detroit, Cleveland, Jacksonville, & Houston

Of the 28 teams remaining teams, 10 have played in the Super Bowl, BUT have not won: Buffalo, Minnesota, Atlanta, Seattle, Carolina, San Diego, Tennessee, Philadelphia, Cincinnati, & Arizona

Of the 18 remaining teams, 6 have won once: New York Jets, Tampa Bay, Kansas City, Chicago, New Orleans, & St Louis / LA

Of the 12 remaining teams, 4 have won twice: Indianapolis / Baltimore, Denver, Miami, & Baltimore

Of the remaining 8 teams, 3 have won 3 times: New England, Washington, & Oakland / LA

Of the remaining 5 teams, 2 have won 4 times: Green Bay & New York Giants

Of the remaining 3 teams, 2 have won 5 times: Dallas & San Francisco

Leaving only Pittsburgh with 6 Super Bowl wins!!

Jets, Baltimore, Tampa Bay, & New Orleans have not lost a Super Bowl game

While New England, Buffalo, Minnesota & Denver have the most Super Bowl Loses- 4

Pittsburgh and Dallas have played in 8 Super Bowls, while New England- 7, San Francisco & Denver - 6, & Green Bay, Giants, Washington, Oakland/LA & Miami- 5 Buffalo has the Most Consecutive Super Bowl appear-

ances- 4 (SB's 25, 26, 27 & 28)

Miami has 3 (SB's 6, 7, & 8)

Dallas has scored the most points with a total of 221 San Francisco has the highest avg. pts. scored per game with- 36.5

Denver has given up the most total points- 206 Buffalo has given up the highest avg. pts. per game-34..75

The Jets have given up the fewest total pts.- 7 Seattle has scored the fewest total pts.- 10

Minnesota has the lowest avg. pts. per game scored-8.5

Max McGee- GB scored the 1st SB TD

Jerry Rice- SF holds the record for Most TD's scored- 8 (4 games)

Joe Montana SF- Holds the record for the Most TD Passes- 11 (4 games)

Emmitt Smith Dal- Holds the record for Most Rushing TD's- 5 (3 games)
