The Memorial honors fallen officers killed in the line of duty and is located at Camp George West, 15055 South Golden Road in Golden Colorado.

The Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial is the official State of Colorado Memorial dedicated to law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty. The Memorial was erected in 1979 as a tribute to Colorado's fallen officers.

In 1998 the site was designated by the State Legislature as an Official State Memorial but no money came with the Bill. Included in the list of the honored and departed are Federal officers as well. In 2014 the Memorial was upgraded to enhance the image and significance of the site. Historical information and research has been an ongoing project and officers are being added as they become known.

The original Memorial had black letters on grey stone and was very difficult to keep in readable condition. The new monument headstone is much easier to read and adds to the quality of the memorial. Commissioned recently is a bronze statue 7.5 feet tall, almost seen in the picture above, that will watch over the entrance of the Memorial. The estimated budget for the completion of improvements to the monument is \$280,000 but is currently around \$50,000 short of that goal. Donor levels are \$10,000; \$5,000; \$1,000; and \$100. Personal Pavers, similar to

the type at Coors Field, can be purchased for \$300. Philip Anschutz who is a major contributor and memorial Fundraising Chair has been instrumental in raising money and supporting the restoration. **John Young** noted our guest is a qualified Monaco South Optimist member.

As shown below, President **Michael Chavez** presented a \$500 contribution to the Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial to help fund the improvement project. He also told Barry he was always welcome to our Friday breakfast Club. OCMS will have a paver at the Memorial.
