Our Speaker Our Own John Young What does Optimism Mean to You?

Editors Note: John Young has been a member of MSOC since 1976. Yes, he is a charter member. John served as the club's president 1982-1983. He and his wife Claire, have been instrumental in many leadership and promotional actives to promote optimism!

Our guest speaker this morning was not a guest at all. In fact, he was charter member of Monaco South Optimist Club **John Young**. John spoke on the topic of "What Does Optimism Mean to You." John introduced us to Ron Stanley whom sponsored John when the Monaco South Club was being built in 1976. John has since lost track of Ron but thinks he is now in Texas. He thanks Ron often for having impacted his life so profoundly in 1976. John said we all should

thank our sponsors for inviting us to join the Optimist organization. Editor's comment: *Perhaps we should have a hug your sponsor day at one of our meetings.*

John said the most disappointing moment in his Optimist career happened on December 30, 1976 when the President Gerald Ford declined an invitation to attend a Monaco South breakfast meeting. John was looking forward to sponsoring President Ford as an Optimist member. The most memorable moment for John was when Monaco South sponsored the Tamarac club in 1993. That club has grown to become the second largest club in the Colorado-Wyoming District.

The best officer installation banquet, as remembered by John, was the one held at the Phipps Mansion in 1984. This one was particularly memorable for this editor as I was the outgoing president at the time.

John has been on a long time search for the one

word that best describes the Optimist organization and he thinks he has finely found it. That one word is <u>KINDNESS</u>. There are many quotes about kindness but one of John's favorite is "Neither genius, fame or love show the greatness of the soul. Only kindness can do that."

Men spend their lives seeking happiness and Optimists are generally happy people. That is because they have discovered what makes men happy. That is to: "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, to all the people you can, for as long as

you can."

John invited several other members to talk about what optimism means to them. The stories varied a bit but the bottom line was best summed up by that old Budweiser commercial quote: "I love ya, man."

John often thinks back to 1976 and asks, What if ... What if Ron Stanley had never asked him to join the Monaco South Optimist Club as a charter member? If John had never joined the club then some 60 other members may not have gotten the chance to join. We need to share optimism with everyone we know. Ask

someone to come to a meeting and give them the opportunity to become an Optimist. Otherwise, we might be left to wonder, What if?
