Oscar Sorensen reminded members that April 11th will be Election Day for the club and to remind interested parties to submit names for the available positions to him. Continued next page



Speaker Today Dan Roybal

The speaker today Dan Roybal (on the left in the picture), was introduced by **Ron Cisco**. Ron talked about working with Dan who is the director at the Cope Branch for Boys and Girls Club, Inc. Dan has been with the Boys and Girls Club for 25 years and Ron



mentioned what a pleasant and positive environment Dan has created for the kids there.

Dan Roybal is one the lucky people in this world who has found what he enjoys doing in life and gets paid to do it. He spoke about the William E. Cope Branch of the Boys and Girls Club, located at 808 Inca Street in Denver. The clubs goal is to provide young people, ages 6-18, with a safe and positive place to spend their free time. In the Club, youth engage in safe, educational and fun activities led by youth developmental professionals that guide members to help them realize their full potential. And they do this for \$2 per year!

Programs include a Technology section, which teaches Microsoft office basics, animation, music mixing, and web page design among others. Education and Career Development that helps kids with homework, offers reading and writing programs, job preparation, information on scholarships and more. They also have and Arts program where kids

can participate in painting, ceramics and drama. They also hold a youth of the year banquet featuring presentations and skits by the kids. The sports, fitness and recreation areas offer organized sports including football, street hockey, soccer, basketball, baseball, and cheerleading. Dan mentioned a past baseball league sponsored by the Optimists Club. The club also offers courses in Character and Leadership Development, the Gates Camp is an 80 acre camp located in Ward, CO which allows kids to explore outdoor activities such as hiking and fishing in an outdoor setting.

Dan mentioned that typically he has 130 kids show up on a daily basis and at closing time, at 9, there are still 70-80 kids there. It is a place where they can feel safe and have a structured environment to participate. He thanked the club for their programs at Thanksgiving and Christmas and mentioned how much the community valued them.

All 8 Boys and Girls Clubs are under one organization with an annual budget of \$8 million. They also have been supported by the major league teams in the city with tickets provided to games and mentioned the field donated by the Colorado Rockies and the great Big Cat, Andres Galarraga! Marcus Camby from the Denver Nuggets, has also been a supporter of the club sponsoring families for meals and 15 lucky kids at Christmas time to buy gifts for their loved ones.

Earliest Easter...March 23rd



Have you realized how early Easter is this year? As you may have heard, Easter is always the 1st Sunday after the 1st full moon after the Spring Equinox (which is March 20)—the Paschal full moon. This dating of Easter is based on the lunar calendar

that Hebrew people used to identify Passover, which is why it moves around on the Roman calendar.

Based on the above, Easter can actually be one day earlier (March 22) but that is pretty rare. Here's the interesting information. This year is the earliest Easter any of us will ever see the rest of our lives! And only the most elderly of our population have ever seen it this early (95 years old or above!). And none of us have ever, or will ever, see it a day earlier!

Here are the facts:

- The next time Easter will be this early (March 23) will be the year 2228 (220 years from now). The last time it was this early was 1913 (so if you're 95 or older, you are the only ones that were around for that!).
- The next time Easter will be a day earlier, March 22, will be in the year 2285 (277 years from now). The last time Easter was on March 22 was 1818. So, no one alive today has or will ever see it any earlier than this year!

Passover (April 20-26, 2008) was instituted the evening preceding the Exodus from Egypt. The first



Passover was observed about the time of the full moon on the 14th day of Nisan. This was therefore to be celebrated annually. This date falls within the months of March and April of the Gregorian calendar. Seasonally, it fell at the beginning of the barley harvest.
