Keith Dameron

Retired State Patrol Captain & Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial Historian

Introduced by **Steve Kady**, who said he had known our speaker for 40 years, <u>Keith Dameron</u>, a retired Colorado State Patrol Captain who retired in 2001 and is currently historian for the Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial is currently working on uncovering the stories of law enforcement officers who died while on duty. Keith researches and determines whose name rightfully belongs on the memorial, but, for whatever reason, have not been recognized.

The Memorial, when first erected in

1979 at Camp George West, near Golden, originally contained 105 names. The number of names on the memorial has increased to a total of 302. Many of the names added were, unfortunately a result of on duty deaths of various Colorado law enforcement officer since 1979, but more than a few are the result of Captain Dameron's diligent research into deaths which occurred before 1979, but were not known at the time, dating back to the mid 1800's, when Colorado first became at state.

Captain Dameron is a walking encyclopedia of knowledge and held the entire audience spellbound as he related many stories of some of the officers whose names have been added to the memorial, many as a result of his diligent research into old newspaper articles, archives and history books. An example of his efforts were captured in this *Denver Post* article by Kevin Simpson, on April 27, 2010.

Barbara Miercort was just 2 when her father died, and so Morris Dolan existed for her as only an idea, shaped over the years into a heroic figure by old news clippings and a young girl's yearnings.

Soon, his legacy will be etched in stone.

Dolan, who served as both police and fire chief of Cripple Creek, perished in a 1940 rooming house fire after he raced into the building, which had been intentionally set ablaze, it was later determined, by one of his firefighters.

Dolan's will be one of 13 names engraved on the Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial this year, joining more than 200 others who died in the line of duty.

Only one of the new names is an officer who died in 2009, David J. Kinterknecht, a Montrose police officer killed in July. The rest will be like Dolan, "historical deaths" overlooked or forgotten over the years.

"It makes him seem real," said Miercort, who will travel from her home in Dallas to honor her father at the May 7 ceremony at the Colorado State Patrol Academy in Golden. "He was a phantom. I have no conscious memory of him — but boy, did I miss him. I made him into a knight in shining armor. And I guess he was a pretty good guy."

Finding those historic names and researching their deaths has become the passion of Keith Dameron, a retired State Patrol trooper and the memorial committee's historian.

"Every police funeral, you hear the words, 'We will never forget you,'" Dameron said. "But the reality is, these historical deaths show how easy it is to forget things you think you never will, as an organization or department. But I think every one of these stories is worth noting."


Sometimes agencies or relatives bring oversights to his attention. Other times he finds candidates on his own while combing through files, library records, Internet sites and family correspondence. He researched the 12 historical candidates whose names will be inscribed this year and is already researching details on another seven that likely will be added next year.

The details just sticks with him.
