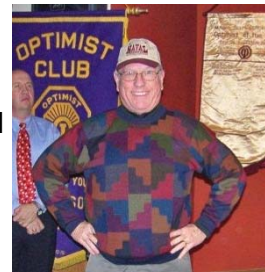


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Gift Exchange

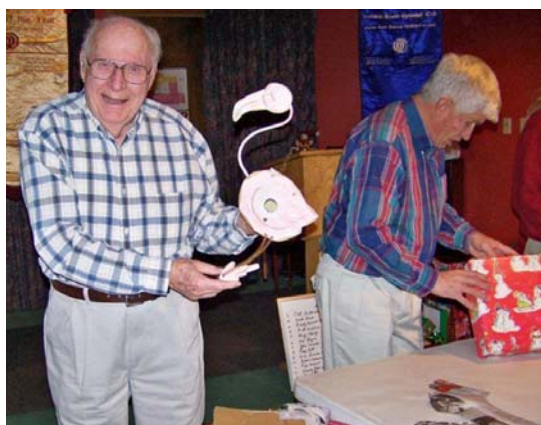


Frank Ross modeling his sheik multi colored robe.
