Our on site videographer, Tom Hoch caught all the action and highlights are being posted on the website. It was a great day at the MSOC and the Furry Scurry 11,000 adults and 5,000 furies strolling for DDFL, 31,000 feet padding around the Park. The event raised OVER 1 MILLION dollars to be used for funding 4 Critter Camps for kids and dogs, underwriting a year long program of ½ price adoptions and reaching out to over 22,000 kids this year by teaching them about the DDFL mission of "Respect for Life." Guess we better show up with more burritos and McMuttins' next year. Thanks go out to **Don StJohn** and **Phil Perington** for coordinating this community project.

Activities Today

Monaco South member **Andy McKean**, who also happens to be Executive Director of Liberty Day, explained this project to our visiting dignitaries and guests. In order to promote interest in the U.S. Constitution, 5th grade students study the

Constitution themselves, then go out in the community and ask question regarding the constitution. They passed out a booklet containing both the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence. Andy

mentioned that September 17 is "Constitution Day" as mandated by Congress and that all schools are required to have programs regarding this important document on this date.

Karl Geil introduced "the brains behind the Brain Bowl." Connie Ackerman and Rich Urbanowski talked about how the Brain Bowl has grown from around 30 teams in 2001 to over two hundred and from one site to three, including Denver, Boulder, and Colorado Springs. They also thanked members of Monaco South for their support of this event, indicating that the club was a major source of support, both monetarily and in numbers of volunteers. A show of hands indicated that more than half of our members have participated in the Brain Bowl at some time.

Karl Geil also talked about History Day in Colorado, the theme of which was "Innovation in History: Impact and Change." Middle school and high school students from all over Colorado participated and 32 entries were chosen to compete at National History Day at the University of Maryland, one them a 6th grader from Hamilton Middle School. Also, a past recipient of our club's Excellence in Education award. Leslev Mever, was selected as the Junior Division Colorado History Day Teacher of the Year, which puts her in the running for National History Day Teacher of the Year. Due to state budget cuts, next year may be the last year for Colorado History Day for the foreseeable future.
