The Case Against FOOs

We hear about FOOs at meetings, but what are they? FOO stands for Friend of Optimism. It is a program Optimist International put into place a few years ago where for \$100; a person can make another person a FOO. The Club receives \$40 from this amount, and the FOO receives the club newsletter and the OI magazine. Other than being able to vote and hold office, a FOO may pretty much participate in club activities as much as a member.

Sounds like a sweet deal. But wait, there's more.

For membership growth purposes, Optimist International counts FOOs as members of our Club, even though they have never applied for membership nor been voted in. This is where I part ways with the whole FOO idea. Clubs are able to pay for FOO memberships and thereby increase their membership count. By maintaining or increasing their club's size, they can qualify to be an Honor Club even if they have lost actual members during the year.

And what are the requirements to be a FOO? Well, (military veterans may appreciate the upcoming pun) the FOO bar is set pretty low. If you have \$100, or someone has it for you, you are in.

The pressure is on all clubs, I suspect, to dip into the treasury at the end of the year and "honor" those non-members who have done some service to the club with a FOO membership. After all, it only really costs the club \$60 each, and if they do it enough to maintain their membership count, they will be named an Honor Club by the District.

I submit that this scheme is unhealthy for Optimism and our Club in the following ways:

- 1. This is a dishonorable way to become an Honor Club. Buying your way to the top with phantom members is no example to set for kids, members or anyone else.
- It is a misuse of club funds. Using dues and raised funds to buy Honor Club status only serves to feed the ego of the club president. It does nothing to advance the cause of Optimism.
- 3. It actually inhibits bringing new people into club membership. Why work hard at bringing guests and engaging them in the work of the club when you can simply write a check to keep you numbers up? That end of the year push for members is kind of legendary in my recol-

lection of the history of our Club, pre-FOOs. Now, clubs probably still make a push, but when they know their fallback is ponying up \$60 for a couple of FOOs, the pressure isn't on as much to introduce others to the joy of Optimism service.

4. It hobbles the next president. When an end of the year FOO-buying frenzy adds to the membership count, it may get the outgoing president Honor Club President status. But the incoming president is then stuck with membership roles larded up with folks who may not care about continuing as FOOs or becoming real members. If the new president and board decide that paying for FOOs from club funds is improper, they will have a big hole to dig out of when those FOOs are dropped for non -payment. If the club does decide to fund all of their existing FOOs, it will become a club expense year after year, kicking the can down the road until some president has the guts to say "enough!" and probably take the hit of not becoming an Honor Club President.

Of course, FOO memberships can be purchased with non-club funds. While Monaco South has, in the past, purchased FOOs with Club funds, it no longer does so. The 16 FOOs listed in the back of the April, 2015 Club Directory either are paid for by someone else (such as a Club member) or pay their own way. The Club has no way of stopping this – it gets no say in who becomes a FOO.

The problem for our incoming administration will be with any of those 16 FOOs who either no longer want to pay \$100 per year for a magazine and newsletter, or whose benefactors no longer want to pay for them. If they are dropped, it counts as a reduction in our Club's membership. And those 16 FOOs make up more than 10% of our total membership.

Of course, if the Board caves in next September and pays for a bunch of FOOs, Honor Club status can again be ours. The District will look good. OI will be happy (they got some extra money in \$60 increments). But I hope we, the members, will not be happy. And I am sure the Board has no intention of doing such a thing. Instead, we are going to work hard to bring in real members, members who can help with the work of serving kids, our Club, and our community.
